


2.1 - Are you aware that a gun safety bill (Bipartisan Safer Communities Act) recently passed Congress and was signed into law?

2.6 - Do you agree with the Supreme Court's decision to expand Americans' rights to carry guns in public?





2.10 - Do you believe that Democrats are able to do more to protect abortion rights but are choosing not to do so?







2.13 - Do you have faith in the Supreme Court as a non-partisan institution?



2.14 - Do you believe the Supreme Court's decisions reflect the values of America as a whole?





2.16 - Which of the following proposals (if any) to reform the Supreme Court do you support? (Select all that apply)









2.18 - If November's Midterm elections were held today, how likely are you to vote?



2.19 - If the 2022 midterm elections were held today, would you vote for the Democratic or Republican congressional candidate on the ballot?





2.21 - Knowing the Supreme Court has overturned the right to an abortion, are you more or less likely to vote in November?



2.22 - Knowing the Supreme Court has overturned the right to an abortion, are you more or less likely to support Democratic candidates in the midterms?





2.24 - Do you approve of the job Joe Biden is doing as President?



2.25 - Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the Democratic Party?



2.26 - Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the Republican Party?



2.27 - How would your perception of the Biden Administration change if they instituted a White House Young American Advisory Council to voice the concerns of young people?





2.29 - How would your perception of the Biden Administration change if they appointed a Director of Youth Engagement?






